


BOYS WON'T BE BOYS

Boys Won't Be Boys, is a **Dutch theatrical and social movement focused on male emancipation**. Featuring over 100 performers, Boys Won't Be Boys has staged more than 200 performances across the Netherlands.

Led by artistic director **Rikkert van Huisstede**, the show provides a unique space for performers to share **personal stories that challenge societal expectations of masculinity**, exploring themes of **gender and identity**.

Aligning with the **Institute's Masculinities programme** established in 2019, Boys Won't Be Boys offers a barrier-free teaching moment fostering new perspectives on contemporary masculinities through cross-disciplinary collaboration between the Benelux and Finland.

PERFORMANCE & IMPACT

The Finnish debut of *Boys Won't Be Boys* took place at two prestigious venues: **Svenska Teatern in Helsinki in May** and **Oulun teatteri in Oulu in September 2024**. These performances were enriched by a diverse cast from Finland, including actor and former MP **Jani Toivola**, multifaceted artist and educator **Julian Owusu**, and cultural and gender studies scholar **Daniel Woodward**, among others.

The production skilfully blended music, spoken word, and dance, delivering raw, personal narratives that invited audiences to reflect on gender roles while offering fresh perspectives on contemporary masculinity. Each performance concluded with a meet & greet, allowing the audience to engage in intimate discussions with the cast and share their own stories in a welcoming, safe space. Following the second performance in Helsinki, the media platform Jäbät ja Tunteet hosted a special *Conversation Club*, where cast members joined audience members and community participants in curated discussions, deepening the dialogue around the show's themes.

Performed in English, Finnish, and Dutch, with Swedish subtitles, the shows were designed to be accessible to a wide and diverse audience. The strategic choice of venues—one catering to a Swedish-speaking audience in the south, the other to a Finnish-speaking audience in the north—broadened the show's reach and impact. This approach successfully attracted a mix of theatre enthusiasts, first-timers, and a cross-section of queer and straight audiences, transcending cultural and generational divides and creating a safe, inclusive space for meaningful conversations about masculinity.

The Finnish debut left a profound impact, igniting important conversations about masculinity and the diverse ways of being a man in today's world. The combined expertise of the Institute, van Huisstede, and the talented cast enriched the programming and broadened the skill sets at both theatres. This project not only laid strong foundations for future collaborations between the partners but also embodied van Huisstede's inclusive approach, fostering a circle of trust and warmth among the artists. As a result, genuine friendships and lasting connections have blossomed, strengthening the creative community between Finland and the Benelux.




